Philadelphia, PA, USA — The Web site for the International Centre on Nurse Migration, a joint endeavor between CGFNS International and the International Council of Nurses (ICN), which serves as a global resource for the development, promotion and dissemination of research, policy and information on global nurse migration, has been redesigned to showcase the work of the Centre since its inception in 2005.

Three commissioned papers: *Return Migration of Nurses*, *Nursing Self-Sufficiency/Sustainability in the Global Context* and *Positive Practice Environments: Key Considerations for the Development of a Framework to Support the Integration of International Nurses* are now easily accessible from the homepage. Fact sheets and e-newsletters also populate the site, in addition to approximately 200 titles with links for global nurse migration research, which will be searchable in the near future.
